Located 20 miles north of Salt Lake City in Kaysville, Judy Chaney and Tina Wilson strive to raise affordable Paint show horses. Breeders of Paint Horses for 20 years, Chaney and Wilson also previously bred, competed and managed Quarter Horses and Thoroughbreds.

"We want a horse that is pretty enough to halter in the morning and has the attitude, conformation and talent to perform in the afternoon," said Wilson. "We don't want to ride an ugly horse, and we don't want a halter horse we can't put a saddle on. We still believe in the all-around horse."

Three Roses Ranch proudly stands Par Te On, an APHA Breeders' Trust-nominated 1994 sorrel overo stallion sired by Te Riffic and out of My Ladys Mercades.

"We purchased Par Te On as a yearling from Pam Brown and Roxcie Rogers in California," said Wilson. "He has been on the APHA leading sires list multiple times and has sired two APHA Champions and the earners of multiple Superiors at halter and in performance events. He has been a leading sire of futurity champions in Utah and Idaho since 1999.

"He is out of My Ladys Mercedes, who is one of the great mares of the industry and also the dam of world champion Dateline," she explained. "Par Te On sired Lets Par Te Hardy, who was the Number 1 APHA Honor Roll 2-Year-Old Gelding in 2007."

Chaney is retired, and Wilson is a procurement officer for local bus and rail property. Nevertheless, the women share a passion for Paint Horses.

"Every foaling is like Christmas," said Wilson. "We never know what will be in the 'package.' We believe it is our responsibility to improve the breed, not just raise babies. We actively foster new blood in the Paint industry and encourage our customers to show their horses."
